Local charity Home-Start is offering a free course to train you to be a home-visiting volunteer, supporting families with difficulties such as post-natal illness, bereavement or disability. The course will run in Hampton Wick from 9.45am-2.30pm, on Thursdays from 9<sup>th</sup> May to 20<sup>th</sup> June (not half-term 30<sup>th</sup> May).
